Spread of COVID-19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Users • Workers • Cleaners • Pitch contractors 	<p>PROMOTING GOOD HYGIENE:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clearly direct people to where they can wash their hands – outside wash basins in multiple locations across the site (science, computing, food blocks) • Ensure that all handwashing stations are in good working order and provide soap, water and paper towels • Use disposable paper towels in handwashing facilities • Clubs should train all players and coaches on appropriate cleaning and disinfection, hand hygiene, and respiratory etiquette • Staff and players should ensure that hand hygiene/ sanitisation is being undertaken upon arrival, during and leaving the facility • Club or parents should provide all players with hand sanitiser for use between play periods, as well as antibacterial wipes for disinfecting player provided equipment • Users should bring their own personalised water bottles to help reduce the transmission risk. Individuals should take their own water bottles home for cleaning and sanitisation • No food should be consumed on site. All litter should be taken home or placed in one of the multiple waste bins across the site <p>KEEP FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT CLEAN:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily cleaning of toilet facilities and outside wash basins 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily check process (soap and paper towels and handwashing stations) • Daily check (promotion posters and signage) • Train all workers on new protocols and the important of good hygiene • A responsible person to check cleaning has taken place as planned • Weekly stock check (cleaning products) • Empty waste facilities regularly • Train all workers on Public Health England guidance for reported COVID-19 cases 		

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify high-contact touch points for more regular cleaning – entrance gate, spectator fencing and goals • Frequent cleaning of work areas and equipment between use • Multiple waste facilities on the 3G pitch and across the site • Gates to 3G to be left unlocked from 3pm to avoid unnecessary touching the padlock. Padlock to be sprayed by Piggott staff. Clubs to lock the facility at the end of the evening as normal • Follow Public Health England guidance if a COVID-19 case is reported at the facility 			
		<p>MAINTAINING SOCIAL DISTANCING AND AVOIDING CONGESTION:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use of Track and Trace QR code on 3G pitch and at various locations across the site including reception • In line with FA guidance groups should not exceed a maximum of 30 (including coaches) • Clubs to be proactive in limiting and managing the amount of spectators using the spectator area during sessions. This should be kept to 30 where possible in order reduce congestion and contact between users. Following the government guidance on spectators at outdoor sporting events <i>“supporters, parents, and other spectators to remain socially distanced whilst attending events. Spectator groups must be restricted to discrete 6 person gathering limits and spread out, in line with wider government guidance. Discrete groups can be larger than 6 where people are from the same household or support bubble”</i>. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monitor effectiveness, especially at peak times • Train workers to promote compliance to facility users • Train workers to report / deal with issues of noncompliance • Daily check (promotion posters and signage). 		

		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sessions involving different groups should be staggered so that one group has time to leave before the next group arrives.• Please ensure that players, coaches and parents wait outside the 3G pitch until the previous group have completely left.• Clubs to manage the entry to the entry and exit to the 3G pitch to avoid overcrowding in particular during changeover of sessions• Ensure the metre plus rule where possible• Single-use doorways to avoid congestion i.e. one-way only entrances / exits• We will limit the indoor facilities that are open to toilets only at this time. Toilet facilities located on the playground to be used by the clubs. These include both males and females facilities. Anyone using indoor facilities should sanitise their hands before and after use.• Users to park in main car park and not on the school playground• Drop off using the turning circle where possible• Encourage users to walk to site where possible to avoid congestion onsite• School currently not running larger school events such as parents evening on site to avoid congestion			
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
